I am a 45-year-old Perth resident and have been visiting the Bremer Bay region since childhood. More recently, I have enjoyed taking my children to the region to camp, fish and explore.

Much of our camping and fishing has taken place to the east of Bremer Bay, along Trigelow and House beaches.

I am concerned that about the introduction of sanctuary zones that will stop many of the fishing activities that I have enjoyed sustainably since I was a child. In particular, the sanctuary zone in front of Gorden Inlet will prohibit shore-based fishing along a stretch of beach that is safe and accessible, as well as close by to campsites.

Shore-based fishing for species such as herring or salmon poses no risk to sustainability and should not be prohibited as part of the marine park. I recommend implementing a 200m setback for this zone to allow shore-based fishing.

The south end of Trigelow beach allows small boats to be launched. This provides access to deeper water offshore from the Doubtful Islands which provide small boats with an opportunity to catch bottom fish such as pink snapper, queen snapper and nannygai. The area to the east of the islands is a popular area to fish.

I recommend either removing the sanctuary zone to the east of the Doubtful Islands, or altering this zone in some manner to allow fishing from small vessels.
